EVALUATIONS:

Students are evaluated on timeliness, sanitation, presentation, clinic duties, medical records, conflict resolution, team work and attitude. Students must complete the "Student Competency checklist" and clinical evaluations with a minimum grade of 80%. Students start out with 100% and receive deductions which are listed in table below. Failure of an evaluation is a 15% deduction. There will also be a written evaluation of the knowledge acquired during the labs and clinic (60% needed to pass). The "GPRC Animal Health Technology Student Competency Checklist" must be completed and handed in to the primary instructor prior to the last day of scheduled AH 455 class.

Deductions for AH 455 are based on the below deduction guideline. Any deductions that accumulate throughout this course will be taken off the final grade in AH 455 (Clinic, Small animal, Large animal)

GRADING CRITERIA:

Students must complete the "Student Competency checklist" and clinical evaluations with a minimum grade of 80%. A minimum of 60% must be achieved on the final exam for successful completion of the course.
