REQUIRED TEXT/RESOURCE MATERIALS: Harvest, Antigone (Sophocles), Antigone (Anouilh), The Great Gift of Tears, The Memorandum, The 1940's Radio Hour, Tegonni.

CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: The origins and development of theatre Art; introduction to the theatre aesthetics; group exploration of some of the craft and experience of theatre performances. Attendance at live theatrical performances. Note: The Department will endeavor to arrange class attendance at dress rehearsals at least two local live theatre performances. Students unable to attend these rehearsals will be responsible for the admission cost of the performances.

DELIVERY MODE(S): Lecture

OBJECTIVES (OPTIONAL):

- Students will become better able to critically assess and appreciate plays and their performance.
- Students will experience a number of different plays from different genres and periods of history.
- Students will gain an understanding of what is involved in taking a script and turning it into live theatre.
- Students will gain experience in writing critically about plays and performance.
