discussion and through the attendance of at least one live theatrical

performance. We will also endeavour to have theatre artists come to class to

talk about their work.

Course The course is structured as a lecture course that will rely on group discussion.

Class assignments will include a theatre review, mid-term group project and presentation, and a term paper. The final exam will be structured for written

essay answers.

Evaluation: Class participation 15%, mid-term project 30%, final exam 25%, term paper

20%, theatre review 10%.
