COURSE

DESCRIPTION:

This course will introduce the student to the genre of the short story by examining the structural qualities of a number of representative short stories. Some attention will be paid to critical essays discussing the Short Story milieu, but the focus of attention will be on critical analysis of both early and

modern stories by the recognized masters in the field.

PREREQUISITE: EN 1000/1010 or an equivalent course.

OBJECTIVES:

A. Gaining a broader understanding and appreciation of an intellectualcultural activity -- namely, the close study of the Short Story.

Developing skill in expressing oneself orally and in writing. B.

COURSE

REQUIREMENTS:

A. Two essays - 25% each.

B. A one-hour mid-term guiz - 10%. C. A three-hour final examination - 30%

D. Attendance and Class Participation - 10%

Lynch, Gerald and David Rampton. Short Fiction: An Introductory

INSTRUCTION:

Lectures and group discussions.
