### Course Description

Successful completion of this course will allow students to advance to first year university level French.

#### Attendance

As new language structures will be introduced daily, class attendance is deemed essential. A pattern of missing classes will eventually manifest itself in poor performance and failing grades. Class participation is strongly encouraged!!! A student who has missed a total of ten classes in any semester without demonstrating just cause for the absences, and whose average for the term is below fifty percent, may, at the descretion of the instructor, be barred from writing the final exam.

#### Activities

Wednesdays will be lab days. Please remember to bring your blank cassettes and your workbooks. You will then hand in your workbooks on the following day (Thursdays). All written/aural quizzes will be on Fridays. Refer to the timetable below for the dates of the midterm and final exams. The midterm and final exams will have a written, aural and oral component.

# Exams and Assignments

There will be <u>five quizzes</u>, each worth five percent for a total of 25% of your final mark.

The midterm exam will be valued at twenty-five percent, and a final exam worth twenty-five percent. Both exams have a written, aural and oral component. The remainder of your grade will be made up as follows:

One oral report, to be delivered at a pre-chosen time during the last full week of the semester. (Worth five percent)

One essay, due on December 3, 1993 and worth five percent.

Weekly lab work/assignments worth ten percent of final mark.

Active class participation worth five percent of final mark. This is an easy five percent for those who activity participate in classroom activities and whose input adds to the quality of the course. Participation in activities organized by the French Monitor (if available) will also be considered.

\*If you budget your time wisely, there should be few problems in keeping to the schedule.
