It is expected that to pass this course, a student will be doing a minimum of one hour of formal practice per day. The juried recital performance will be a formal event showcasing student performances either at the end of first term or the early part of second semester. One or two selections of music will be chosen to perform by the student. The April jury will consist of a performance of a minimum of two styles of music and a display of technical exercises. **Master class is an integral component of the student success in this course.** It will consist of student performances, piano literature lectures and student presentations.

Students are required to attend 10 professional Fine Arts Department events (e.g. Concert Series, Visitor In The Arts, etc.) over the course of the year.
