Course Description: A study of elementary diatonic harmony.

Prerequisite: Rudiments of Music or satisfactory completion of a Music Theory Placement Exam.

Co-requisite: MU 1510 Aural and Keyboard Skills

The Course in Perspective: This is an elementary theory course designed to give students an understanding of the basic components which constitute music theory. They will acquire a practical knowledge of diatonic harmony and musical analysis which will assist them in composition and creative assignments. Harmonizing melodies and realizing a figured bass of moderate difficulty will be a component of the course content. The first ten chapters of Music in Theory and Practice will be covered in MU 1550.
