Course Description: This course is a complementary extension of the study of diatonic harmony initiated in MU 1550. This intermediate theory course explores more complex harmonic chord progressions and introduces the use of dominant seventh and secondary dominant sevenths, leading tone seventh chords and nondominant seventh chords in the context of modulation. Compositional and analytical skills are further refined in the study of binary and ternary forms.
