Calendar Description:	This course continues the study of Common Practice harmony and elementary formal analysis.		
Course Content:	Students will continue to gain a practical knowledge of diatonic harmony, formal analysis and compositional techniques. As the highest percentage of learning occurs through the application of knowledge students will be asked to complete several assignments throughout the term. This course will be covering roughly chapters 10 to 17 of the text. Students may be asked to use aspects of aural skills such as singing, solfegging, or intoning of rhythms to reinforce certain theoretical concepts that are being examined throughout the course. Students in this course will also spend some time discussing how most of the material covered in this course is used by composers of "popular" music.
