This is a full year course, which will include several concert performance opportunities, as well as the possible opportunity for solos as needed in repertoire selected. Choral Ensemble II is part of the NWP Concert Choir that also includes community members.

- Development of good vocal and choral singing technique including posture, breath control, and tone
- Development of choral blend
- Develop abilities as a sight-reader, and ear development including pitch accuracy and independence
- Gain experience singing high quality choral repertoire and understanding of styles of choral music
- Continue to develop the ability to work with others towards achieving excellence in choral-ensemble performance
