PROGRESSION CRITERIA:

Academic Progression Criteria

A grade of C- is the minimum passing grade for all Practical Nursing courses in the program. For promotion from term to term in the program and for graduation, students must have successfully completed all the required Practical Nursing and non-Practical Nursing courses of the previous term.

A student with a GPA of 1.69 or lower must withdraw from the Practical Nursing program.

Readmission to the program is subject to departmental review.

Students who withdraw or fail twice from a required practical nursing course will be withdrawn from the program and ineligible for re-admission.

Clinical Progression Criteria

Attendance for all clinical days is expected. Absences from the clinical site may result in the instructor being unable to evaluate the student's clinical performance. If clinical performance cannot be evaluated, a failing grade may be assigned in the course. Whenever a student's clinical performance is

considered marginal in a nursing course, the student's total academic and clinical performance in the program is reviewed and considered in determining continuation in the program.

An instructor, in consultation with the Chair, may immediately deny assignment of a student to, may withdraw a student from, or vary the terms or conditions or a site of a practicum/clinical placement, if the instructor has reasonable grounds to believe that this is necessary in order to protect public interest.

Clinical practice preparation

Professional responsibility for nursing students includes clinical practice preparation related to evidence-informed practice and patient safety. Preparation includes appropriate understanding, synthesis, and integration of relevant knowledge. The clinical instructor, in conjunction with the clinical site, will identify appropriate timeframes for students to access patient records. In order to be adequately prepared for clinical experiences, students will participate in activities outside of their scheduled clinical course hours.

Activities can include the following: specific clinical patient preparation, clinical site orientation, medication systems orientation, patient health record review and review of textbook and relevant evidence-informed articles. Clinical practice preparation is required in addition to direct course hours. Students who are not adequately prepared to provide safe and competent patient care will not participate in clinical activities.

All students and instructors have obligations under the Alberta Health Information Act (2020) and Alberta Electronic Health Record Regulation (2018) related to the safeguarding of a client's personal health information CLPNA Privacy Document. Students are accountable for ensuring that they follow all relevant privacy legislation and policies, and understand the privacy requirements that apply to their nursing practice. Secure access and handling of health information, along with mandatory reporting of potential or actual breaches are required of students and faculty
