NS1205 (A2/B2/C2): Foundations for Success in Nursing - 4 (2-2-0) 60 Hours for 15 Weeks

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CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

The course develops an understanding of self as a learner in a health professions context. It explores the foundations of professional nursing, relational practice, and therapeutic communication. The course promotes reflection on personal perspectives and experiences to understand one's own attitudes, beliefs, and values. It fosters resilience and explores strategies for self-management and growth. Note: Available only to nursing students in the Collaborative Program.

- 1) Acquire learning strategies to enhance their success as a learner
- 2) Appreciate and explore professional nursing at an introductory level
- 3) Explore the concept of health at an introductory level.
- 4) Explore and practice therapeutic communication as the foundation for relational practice
- 5) Reflect on personal beliefs and values and how they influence nursing practice
- 6) Develop and practice mindfulness-based strategies to manage stress and build resilience
- 7) Explore and develop scholarly writing skills.

EVALUATIONS:

1) APA practice paper

The purpose of this assignment is to learn to write in a scholarly manner, to write concisely, and use the most recent version of APA formatting, **APA 7th edition**. This is the only paper you will write in this program where formatting will trump content. This assignment also helps support student learning about the concepts of the course. Students will select **one** of the concepts from the list below:

- Culture
- Health promotion
- Communication
- Spirituality

They will discuss the potential impacts of:

a) The development of a professional identity of a student in this program; OR: b) The health of an individual. on the concept they've chosen.

Students will hand in the assignment in with the following:

- 1. Title page, running head, page numbers.
- 2. Body page with:
 - a. Topic or thesis sentence/statement
 - **b.** A sample sentence that contains either an in-text citation (paraphrasing) or an in text direct quotation.
 - **c.** Concluding sentence that summarizes and provides an interesting/thought provoking message.
- **3. APA Reference** page with **a minimum of two** credible references. One reference will be a textbook, and another will be a peer reviewed nursing literature source (article, professional organization etc.)
- 4. Submit via MyClass drop box.
- 5. <u>Maximum</u> 400 words (not including the title page and reference pages).

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2) Quizzes

Students will complete weekly quizzes that will assist in understanding the concepts being presented in theory classes. Students will be given preparatory work for each week and the quizzes will reflect the content from that preparatory work. All quizzes will be added up and an average will be given to make up the total 20% of the course grade. There is no opportunity to rewrite or reschedule quizzes. A missed quiz will count as a zero on that quiz.

Quizzes are located on the MyClass site under each week for students to access during the week prior to each class.

3) Final EXAM

Content that will be covered in the exam covers all preparatory work on MyClass, including theory class, seminar class and the quizzes.

4) Medical Terminology Online Course

Students will complete Medical Terminology Online with Elsevier Adaptive Learning for Medical Terminology: A Short Course (8th ed.) via self-directed study. A medical terminology quiz based upon the learning you have acquired from the medical terminology online course will be completed during theory class time at the end of the course (see assignment list above). To obtain credit in the course ALL assignments, examinations, and quizzes must be completed. Students are expected to make every effort to complete assignments on time. Assignment submissions are expected on the date determined by faculty. If extensions are necessary, they may be requested up to 48 hours prior to the assignment due date and should be submitted in writing to the faculty member involved.
