Scholarly Assignment:

Students will be required to write a 1250-word (excluding the title page, in-text citations and reference pages) scholarly paper with proper APA (7th edition) formatting. The purpose of this assignment is to give students an opportunity to focus on select concepts in more depth and explore the nurse's roles and responsibilities in promoting optimal health and wellness for a particular age group who live with an acute, episodic, or chronic illness.

Midterm and Final Examinations:

Content that will be covered in the exams includes all preparatory work on myClass and theory class. Exams are cumulative, meaning that concepts tested in the first exam will be tested in the second exam to ensure students have built a strong foundation of knowledge and understanding.

For example, a paper marked at B+ would receive an adjusted grade of B if handed in one day late. After 5 days, a grade of 0 will be awarded to the assignment. If the late penalty places the grade below the necessary pass grade, students will be unsuccessful in the course. When submitting assignments electronically, it is the student's responsibility to ensure the assignment has been received. Papers/assignments may not be rewritten for a higher grade. Concerns regarding grading are to be discussed with the faculty member involved.
