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CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

Hours

This course covers expert level concepts and techniques of Microsoft Word through lectures, demonstrations, and hands on practical applications. Emphasis will be placed on the production of professional business documents such as long documents, fill-in forms, merged documents including multi-page merged letters, and desktop publishing documents. Students will be expected to produce these professional business documents in a timed environment. Students will master the software concepts required to gain the Microsoft Certification – Word Expert.

## **COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

The course will teach students to:

- Access and apply a variety of resources and methods to successfully perform proficiency skill sets in MS Word to produce business documents.
- Communicate knowledge of MS Word.
- Transfer knowledge and skills to other computer software programs
- Use MS Word to produce finished documents in accordance with business standards for timely completion, correctness of content and format, professional appearance and creativity.
- Accept responsibility for backup routines and preventive maintenance routines
- Maintains organization by creating and maintaining an electronic file system that stores documents in folders named to display organization. A good system will enable document recovery with 30 seconds.
- Consistently code documents with the file name and path in the footer of each document (see formatting guide).
- Accept that unexpected problems will arise from the use of computers and endeavor to resolve those problems in a professional manner.
- Exhibit ethical behavior with respect to copyright on software, confidentiality, privacy of documents on screen and sharing of files and information.

- Navigate in a document using the Navigation pane, bookmarks, hyperlinks, and crossreferences
- Insert hyperlinks to a location in the same document, a different document, a file in another program, or an email address

- Use the Mail Merge wizard to merge a letter main document with a data
- source file

- Create a building block gallery and save building blocks in a different template

- Insert document property placeholders from Quick Parts
- Insert and update fields from Quick Parts

#### Chapter 8 Managing Shared Document

Upon successful completion of Chapter 8, you will be able to:

- Insert, edit, show, reply to, print, resolve, and delete comments
- Navigate between comments
- Distinguish comments from different users
- Edit a document using the Track Changes feature
- Display changes, show markups, display tracked changed information, and change user information
- Lock the Track Changes feature and customize tracked changes options
- Navigate to and accept/reject changes
- Restrict and enforce formatting and editing in a document and protect a document with a password
- Protect a document by marking it as final, encrypting it, restricting editing, and adding a digital signature
- Open a document in different views
- Share a document electronically
- Manage document versions
