Students will use QuickBooks to go through step-by-step basic to complex tasks for service and merchandising businesses. Students will be exposed to subsidiary journals, accounting ledgers, and audit trail concepts. You will know QuickBooks and be able to use it in the workplace including advanced features such as year-end procedures, tracking time, payroll, job costing, integration with Excel and Outlook and other.
